Summary

Becoming a full-time farmer (2013) as well as co-founding Community Farmers Market (2011) has become a culmination of several focuses from my previous work. After being introduced to local food while working at a large orchard in South Central, KY I went on to pursue a degree in Horticulture at Western Kentucky University. Upon graduating I worked as a Horticulture Extension agent providing educational opportunities to both consumers and producers. My passion for community was extended as I worked as the Landscape Manager for the city of Bowling Green. I realized that working with several organizations to develop a system that was successful could be both challenging and monumental. After leaving my permanent position to stay home with my children I began farming alongside my husband, volunteering in the community and became more passionate about local and healthy foods. I quickly realized that many families were struggling to meet their own basic needs regardless of income level. After becoming involved with the local birth and breastfeeding community and organizations that serve women and families I quickly realized that by simply providing a sense of community and making local food more accessible we could develop a stronger local food system that would also support farmers incomes.
